Victor Hugo, 19th Century French poet, novelist, and author of the critically acclaimed novel about social injustice, *Les Misérables,* once wrote "Nothing is more powerful than an idea whose time has come." Inspired by the political unrest which eventually led to the French Revolution, this quote was not only profound, but also prophetic. The hand writing was on the wall. Social unrest was reaching a boiling point. The line between the haves and the have not was getting larger and larger. Misuse and abuse of the people had become common place. Oppression of any people can be tolerated only so long and when the people have had enough, **For Such a Time As This,** the people will rise up and rise up they did.

What irony! The French were inspired and embolden by what they witnessed in America. They watched as we broke away from an oppressive aristocracy.
