It's just what happens with new life and we cruise through these formative years on automatic pilot with prompting and guidance by the adults around us. But The Question is present and ever with us. Psalm 1:1&2

The Word of God is **Powerful** Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

The Word of God Is **Everlasting** 1Peter 1:25 "But the word of the Lord endureth forever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you." Finally, The Word of God is **Salvation** John 1:14 "<u>And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.</u>" Jesus Christ is not only the Word of God, He is **The Answer to The Question!**
